## THE ROLE OF FOOD BANKS IN CURBING FOOD WASTE AND PROMOTING FOOD SECURITY IN NIGERIA.



Nigeria faces a paradox: despite producing enough food, millions go hungry while an estimated **38 million** tonnes are wasted each year. Much of this waste happens early in the supply chain due to poor storage, unreliable power, bad roads, and weak cold-chain systems, while household habits like over-purchasing and poor storage add to the problem. These losses drive up food prices, reduce farmers' incomes, and worsen the state of food insecurity.

According to the **National Bureau of Statistics**, as at 2022, about **133 million** Nigerians were estimated to be faced with acute hunger, a figure that could rise without decisive action. The environmental impact is also significant, as food waste generates methane, consequently leading to wastage of valuable resources like water, land, and energy.

Food banks offer a practical solution by rescuing safe, surplus food and redistributing it to those in need, reducing waste and emissions while improving access to nutrition.

In Nigeria, the Lagos Food Bank Initiative stands out as a leading example, playing a vital role through its **AgriRecovery Programme**, which recovers excess harvests from farmers and delivers fresh, nutritious produce to vulnerable communities. These efforts have benefitted millions while reducing environmental waste.

Addressing food waste at scale will require better storage infrastructure, power supply, farmer support, public awareness, and policies that encourage safe food donation. Supporting Initiatives like the Lagos Food Bank Initiative can help transform food waste into a positive impact for both people and the environment.

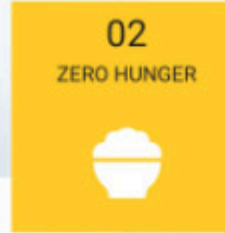

Poverty, hunger, and food insecurity continue to drive poor maternal and child health in Nigeria, where under-five deaths account for 17% of the global burden and disproportionately affect the poorest households.

Through targeted nutrition support, NUMEPLAN addresses this urgent nutrition gap by ensuring malnourished children, pregnant women, and lactating mothers receive essential nutrients needed to prevent or treat malnutrition.

Undernourished lactating mothers and malnourished babies under the age of 5, and food insecure pregnant women.

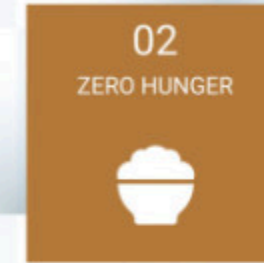

# TEMPORARY FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Supporting



As of late 2025, approximately 27.2 million people in Nigeria face a crisis or worse food security conditions. In Lagos, the food insecurity rate is approximately 30%.

The advantages of the Lagos Food Bank's Temporary Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) are alleviating immediate hunger by providing essential food, allowing families to redirect their limited resources to other needs like school fees and bills, and improving nutrition and overall well-being through the distribution of nutritious food items.

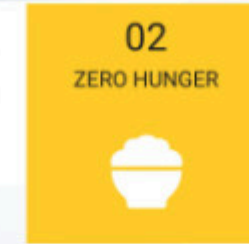

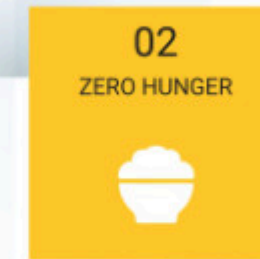
The program is designed to strengthen food security by recovering and redistributing surplus agricultural produce.

Our Job Placement Intervention focuses on helping beneficiaries move into stable income.

Through our TEFAP and NUMEPLAN, we identify individuals who are ready to work but lack access to opportunity, and provide basic employability support and direct referrals to available roles through our partner network.

The focus is connecting people to real jobs within their immediate environment.

While placements are often entry-level, they offer consistency and a pathway out of repeated food dependence. We have seen beneficiaries transition from receiving support to earning and contributing to their households, even within a short period.

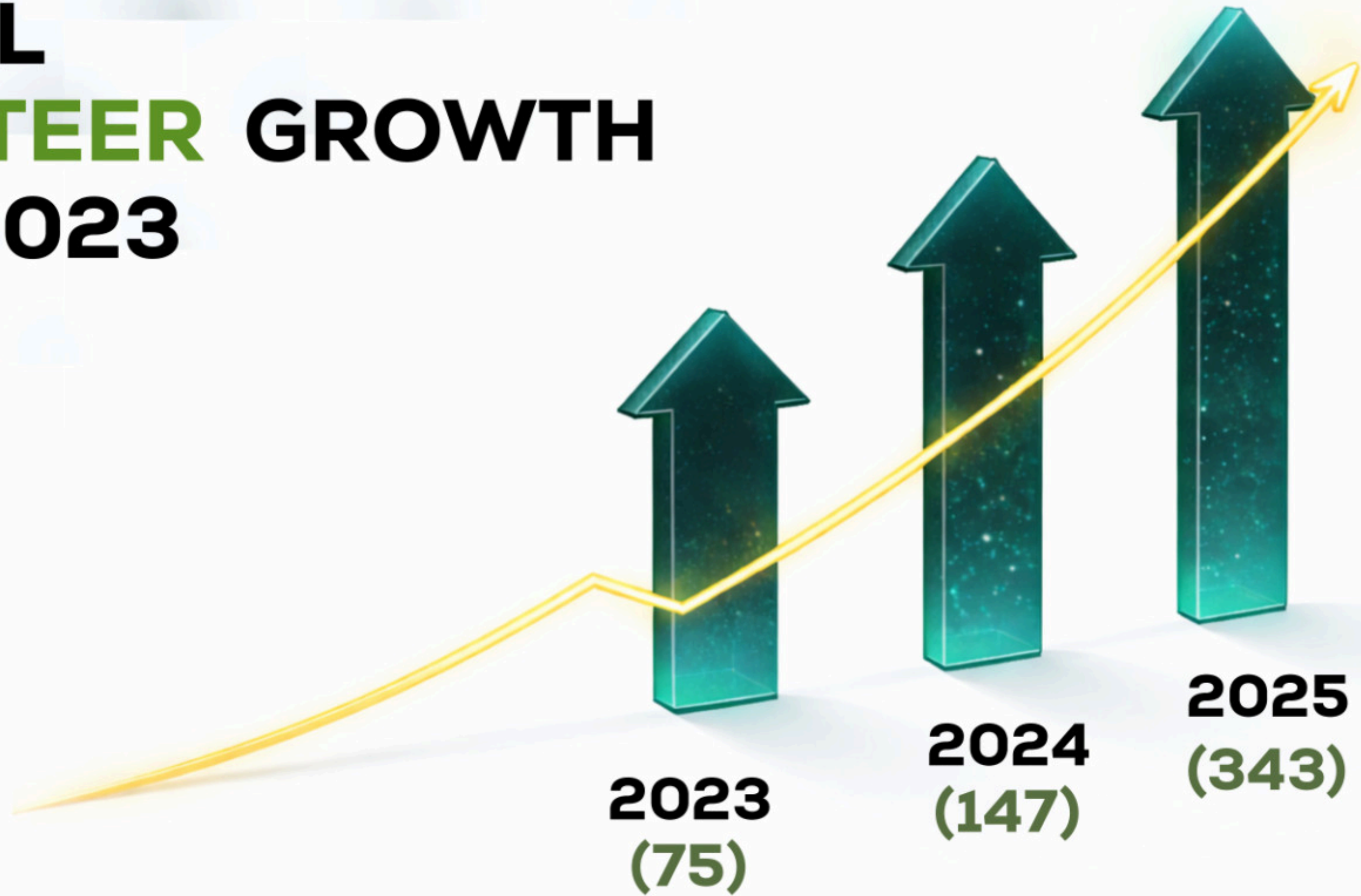

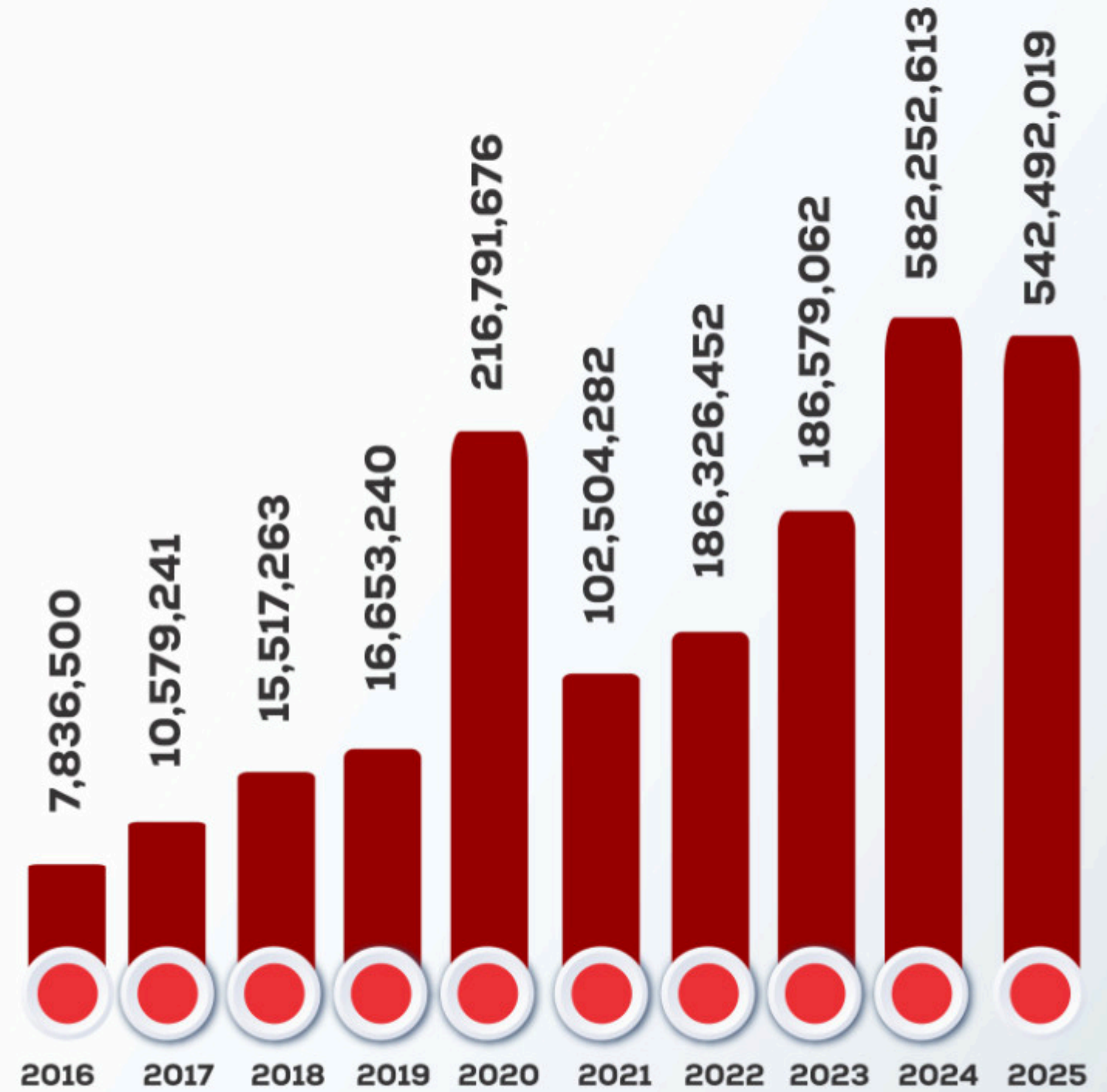
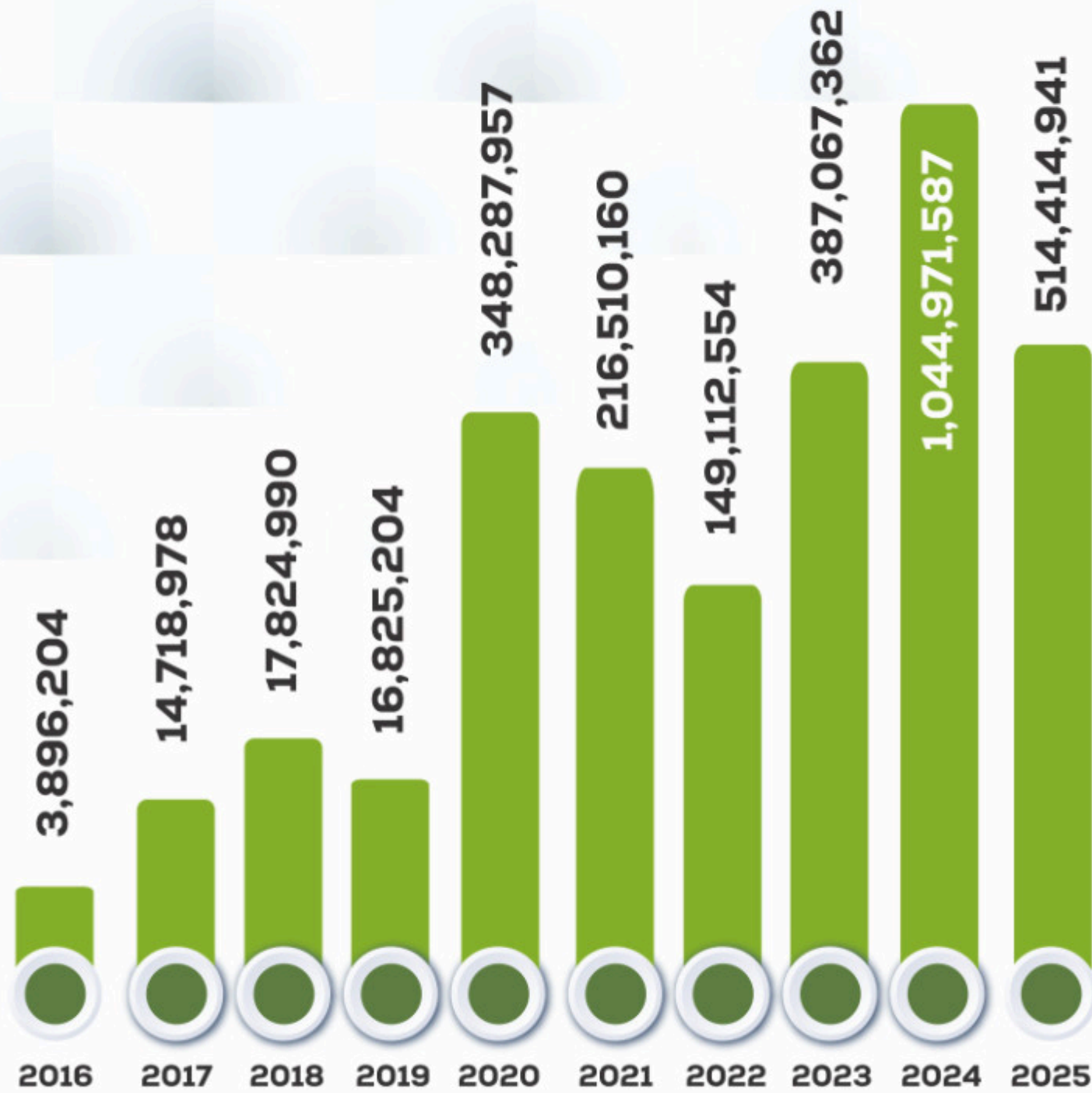
# TARGET FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR

1. Raise 1million USD in funding for FY 2026
2. Improve Lagos Food Bank Initiative internal systems, processes, and operational frameworks to enhance the efficiency, quality, and scale of nutrition and food support delivery to vulnerable populations.
3. Strengthen nutrition outcomes by transitioning the Nutrition Intervention for Diabetes Support (NIDS) into a structured Diabetes Self-Management Education and Support (DSMES) program, while integrating Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH) components into the School Feeding Program.
4. Deploy enhanced IT infrastructure and digital tools to automate Lagos Food Bank Diaspora Community engagement, enabling efficient international fundraising and volunteer coordination.
5. Expand Lagos Food Bank Green Harvest Africa initiative by scaling backyard and family farming while strengthening agricultural recovery through partnerships with commercial farms.
6. Set up and operationalize school gardens in four schools to support nutrition education and experiential learning linked to the EDUFOOD Program
7. Invest in workforce growth, digital infrastructure, and operational assets to support program scale-up and enable LFBI to serve its growing beneficiary base more effectively and sustainably.
8. Increase program coverage to achieve at least a 20% growth in beneficiaries, leveraging partnerships with nonprofit organizations and implementation partners to extend Lagos Food Bank impact beyond Lagos State.
9. Increase LFBI's flexible funding by 30% in 2026, including more donations that can be used for any program and more multi-year grants.
10. Develop a formal support strategy for partner NGOs to improve service quality and expand reach, including shared standards and training

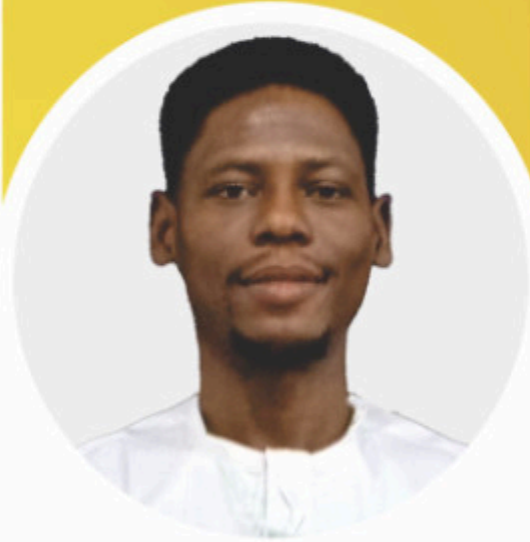
